**Imperative Mode**  
**Πιρῆ† ἡπιζων**

<p>Imperative Mode  <b>Πιρῆ† ἡπιζων</b></p> <p>Takes one of the following forms:          The verb in the infinitive form.          ἄ+ the verb.          ἡ+ the verb.          The irregular verbs.</p>
<p>Negative Imperative Mode          πιζων ἡζωλ          ἡπερ + the verb</p>

1- The verb in the infinitive is used for singular and plural.

Example: A prayer from the vespers.

<p>Φ† <b>ἡαι</b> ἡαν: <b>θεω</b> οὔἡαι ἔρον:  <b>ῥενζη†</b> ζᾶρον: <b>σω†τεμ</b> ἔρον: <b>ἑμο†</b>          ερον: ἄρεζ ἔρον: <b>αριβοῆ†</b> ἔρον:          ὡλι ἡπεκζων† εβοζζᾶρον:  <b>ξεμπε†</b> ζεν πεκο†ζαι: οὔοζ  <b>ζᾶ</b> <b>νε†</b> ἡαν εβοζ.</p>	<p>God have mercy on us, settle Thy mercy on us, have compassion on us, hear us, bless us, guard us, help us, lift Thy anger away from us, care for us by Thy salvation and forgive us our sins.</p>
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Word Analysis

1.	<b>ἡαι</b>	have mercy, pity – verb, imperative mode.
2.	<b>θεω</b>	appoint, lay out – verb, imperative mode.
3.	<b>ῥενζη†</b>	pity have compassion – verb, imperative mode.
4.	<b>σω†τεμ</b>	hear – verb, imperative mode.
5.	<b>ἑμο†</b>	bless – verb, imperative mode.
6.	<b>ἄρεζ</b>	keep – verb, imperative mode.

7.	ἀριβοῦθῆιν	help – verb, imperative mode.
8.	ὀλι	lift – verb, imperative mode.
9.	χεμπενῶνι	care for, concern – verb, imperative mode.
10.	χα	put – verb, imperative mode.

To change these verbs to the negative form add the prefix ὑπερ to the verb.

Example: The Doxology of Fasting (1)

† ἴτωβζ ἄμοκ ὦ Παβ οἰς Ἰη̅ς: ὑπερερσοζι ἄμοι ζεν πεκζωντ: ονδε ον ζεν πεκμβον: ὑπερἴτσω νταμετὰτεμι. † Εθε φαι ἴτωβζ ἄμοκ: Ἰβ οἰς Φ† Πασωτηρ: ὑπερίρι ἵονζαπ νεμη: ἀνοκ ζα πιζωβ ἵρεφερνοβι.	†I ask thee O my Lord Jesus, do not rebuke me by Thy anger, neither (also) by Thy Wrath, do (not) Thou discipline (lit. teach) my ignorance. †For this I ask thee, the Lord God my Savior, do not judge me, I the weak sinner.
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1.	ὑπερσοζι:	do not rebuke, reproof	verb, negative imperative mode
2.	ὑπερἴτσω	do not teach, discipline	verb, negative imperative mode
3.	ὑπερίρι:	do not make	verb, negative imperative mode

2- ἀ + the verb

e.g.      ἀχοc - ἀναγ - ἀογων  
           say    look    open

Example: The Theotokia of Sunday

ζιτεν νεσεγχη: νεμ νεσἵρεσβια: ἀογων    ναν Ἰδ̅ς: ἄφρο ἵτε τεκκλησια.	Through her prayers and her intercessions, open to us O Lord, the door of the church.
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ογων: to open, verb.

ἀογων: open, verb in the imperative mode.

3- μα + the verb

Example: The Ending of Doxologies

<b>Ματσο</b> ἠφνεταρεμασφ: Πενσωτηρ ἠασαθου: ἠτεφωλι ἠηαιθιαι εβολζαρον: ἠτεφσεμνι <b>ηαν</b> ἠτεφζιρηνη.	Ask Him, whom you borne, our Good Savior, to lift these troubles from us, to affirm His peace to us.
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**Ματσο**: ask, verb in the imperative mode.

4- The Irregular verbs.

e.g.

<b>αμου</b> : Come (sing., masc.)	<b>αυις</b> : bring
<b>αμη</b> : Come (sing., Fem.)	<b>μοι</b> : give
<b>αμωινι</b> : Come (plural)	<b>μοινηι</b> : give me

Examples:

1. The Psalia of Tuesday

<b>Δμου</b> <sup>1</sup> ψαρον ἠφουφ: ὠ Πεννηβ <b>Πχς</b> : αριοφωινι ερον: ζεν τεκμεθουφ ετβ οσι.	Come to us today, O our Master the Christ and enlighten us with thy exalted divinity.
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2. The verses of the cymbals

<b>Δμωινι</b> <sup>2</sup> μαρενουωψτ ἠττριας εεφ: ετε φιωτ νεμ Πωηρι νεμ πιΠνευμα εεφ.	Come let us worship the Holy Trinity, that is the Father and the son and the Holy Spirit.
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3. The prayer for the sick

ψυχη νιβεν ετβεχζωχ ουοζ ετοφαναμονι εχωφ <b>μοι</b> <sup>3</sup> <b>νωφ</b> <b>Πος</b> ἠουηαι: <b>μοι</b> <sup>4</sup> <b>νωφ</b> <b>νουμτον</b> : <b>μοι</b> <sup>5</sup> <b>νωφ</b> <b>νουχβοβ</b> : <b>μοι</b> <sup>6</sup> <b>νωφ</b> <b>νουζμοτ</b> : <b>μοι</b> <sup>7</sup> ἠωφ ἠουβοηια: <b>μοι</b> <sup>8</sup> <b>νωφ</b> ἠουωτηρια: <b>μοι</b> <sup>9</sup> <b>νωφ</b> ἠουμετρεφχω εβολ ἠτε νουνοβι νεμ ἠουανομια.	All souls that are distressed and held, give them, Lord, mercy, give hem rest, give them coolness, give them grac, give them help, give them salvation, give them the forgiveness of their sins and their lawlessness.
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1. ἄμoν: come , singular, masculine
  2. ἄμωινι: come, plural
  - 3,4,5,6,7,8 & 9 : μοι: give
  - μοι νωον: give them.
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
